#### **Biographical Note**

J. Roger Miller was born July 16, 1927, in Dollville, Illinois. President Miller completed his both his bachelor's (1949) and master's (1950) degrees in music at Illinois Wesleyan University and received his PhD in Higher Education and Music from the University of Wisconsin (1956). In 1949, while at Illinois Weselyan, he married Arlene P. Truscott of Buenos Aires, Argentina. He served in the U.S. Marine Corps. Dr. Miller joined the Millikin University faculty as an associate professor in the School of Music in 1959. He later became dean of the School of Music, and then vice president for academic affairs for the university. In 1971, Dr. Miller was named president of Millikin University, a position he retained for 20 years, making him (so far) Millikin's longest-serving president. During his tenure, Dr. Miller was also the President of the Federation of Independent Illinois Colleges and Universities and president of Council of Independent Colleges. Dr. Miller retired in 1991, and died in Durham, North Carolina at age 88 in 2015.

#### **Scope and Content Note**

This collection pertains solely to Miller's time as president of Millikin University, and not his time as professor, dean, or VPAA. It captures multiple facets of Miller's time as president.
